



Contest: New / Innovative Grape Varieties

Wines from every province!

Graz, July 2022

In its fourth year, the Austrian wine competition for new/innovative grape varieties that are fungus-resistant again brought an increase in the number of participating wineries and wines. For the first time a high-level international jury was gathered to evaluate PIWI wines from all nine Austrian provinces.

Already for the fourth time the non-profit association “PIWI Österreich” (PIWI Austria) held the competition for new/innovative grape varieties that are fungus-resistant. For the jury tasting on the 21st of July, 209 wines from 92 different establishments were registered! Every province of Austria, ranging from Lake Constance to Lake Neusiedel, was represented with their wines. By now the largest regional PIWI wine competition has become an anchor in the wine year.



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“I am impressed by the high quality of the wines”, were the words of juror Alexander Morandell, president of PIWI International. This pleasing realisation proves the yearly increasing level of PIWI wines.



For the white wines, the most frequently submitted grape varieties were Muscaris, Sauvignon gris, Donauresling and Cabernet blanc, while Roesler and Cabernet Jura dominated the red wine category. Most submissions (91) came from Styria, followed by Lower Austria (77), Carinthia (15), Burgenland (11), Upper Austria (5), Vienna (4) and Salzburg, Tyrol and Vorarlberg with two wines each. This year for the first time there is a separate winning category for sparkling wines.

As in previous years, hosting venue for this jury-based tasting was the modern sensory room of the Versuchsstation Haidegg in Graz. The jury was made up of national and international experts and undertook the evaluation using the international 20-point-system. Depending on the points given, the golden & silver badges will be awarded soon. For one category to be evaluated at least 10 wines had to be submitted.

PIWI?

“PIWI” stands for “pilzwiderstandsfähige Rebsorten” which translates to types of grapes resistant against fungal diseases. These types of grapes are new and greatly innovative. They derive from complex cross-breeding and are not related to transgenic or cisgenic alterations! They are to a greater or lesser extent resistant against the two most important fungal threats in viniculture: Peronospora (downy mildew) and Oidium (powdery mildew). The modern generation of PIWI varieties is not only low-maintenance in the vineyard but has also got potential for excellent types of wine. PIWIs suit the idea of the “Green Deal” excellently. In the future one will not be able to pass by PIWIs if wanting to pursue ecological and economically sustainable wine-growing successfully in the long run! Currently 2% of Austrian vineyard area is filled with PIWIS. The frontrunner is Styria with 3%.

The Association

The association “PIWI Österreich” (PIWI Austria) was founded 2005 as a working group to promote fungal-resistant grape varieties. The purpose of this association is among others knowledge transfer and the exchange of knowledge, the organisation of inspections and study tours, regular meetings, the exchange of experiences as well as public relations work. There are now about 130 members.
